9th GRADE CONFIRMATION

We are in need of one additional small-group leader for 9th grade confirmation. So far, we have 2 group leaders set up. This is a great opportunity for parents to be involved with walking with their child and their friends at this stage of their faith life. We have the materials for you to use, so the preparation time is minimal. Perhaps 2 couples would consider doing this together. We ask that you be able to make a commitment to meet with the young people around 3 times a month. There are a total of 24 sessions that are offered over a two year time table, taking time off over the summer months. The times and locations are flexible, but normally will be offered in your house around the kitchen table or in the living room. You can select the day and time as well.
