Dear parishioners and visitors,

The parish pastoral and finance councils met on June 18th which was the first time since the coronavirus restriction went into effect in March. The major concern was how the parish is doing financially. I believe the members were quite surprised to know that we are doing well considering some loss in income. As of the end of May, the parish is -\$19,334.86 from last year. Presently, all bills should be paid at the end of last month including the diocesan ones. Unfortunately, we did not meet our target for the Diocesan Annual Appeal, and it has to be paid which will be just under \$7,500.00. The parish did qualify for a Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) Loan to pay salaries and utilities which amounted to @ \$153,000.00. I want to thank every parishioner who continued to support during this time! We would not be in the financial condition we are now presently if you had not given.

The diocese encourages parishes to undergo a capital campaign to recoup money-lost since March which our parish is one of them. However, the members wanted to examine our financial status and needs before committing to a campaign. Several members and I will be meeting initially, later with the rest of the council members, and lastly inform the parishioners. Just looking at the financial report will tell you tithing does not cover expenses. Unless we increase our giving, we will fall behind and this says nothing about future needs of the building and grounds.

This will be a daunting undertaking which I hope no one has to call the undertakers! I hope this will help everyone in the parish to know now and where we are going in the future. As the song in the musical Cabaret states, "Money makes the world go round." Time and talent are most important but it takes treasure to keep the mission of the Church going.

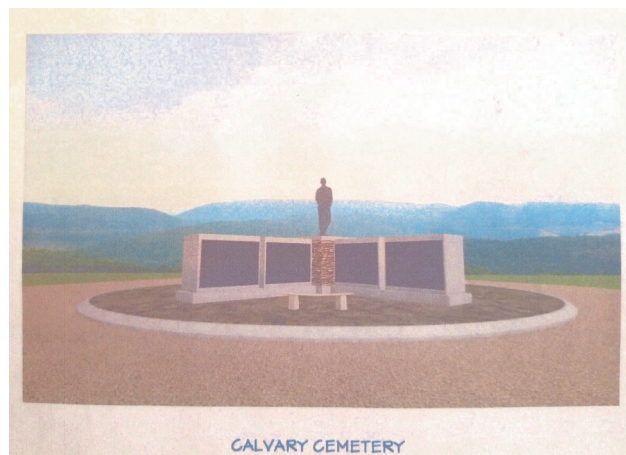

Cemetery Update

The Holy Family Cemetery Committee has approved the reconstruction of the Circle at Calvary Cemetery into a Columbaria Circle. Nationally, 60% plus of new cemetery burials are cremains. During Fr. Weighner's' tenure, we purchased two columbaria walls (48 double niches) and temporarily sited them in the current Calvary Circle.

Architectural drawings were created for a Columbaria Circle, a bid proposal was generated and circulated to area construction firms. The diocese approved our Columbaria Circle plan and a final bid was approved. The reconstruction of the Columbaria Circle will commence in August, with a Labor Day finish date.

During construction, every effort will be made to save the current stonework, and some of the stones will be used to create the pedestal that will support the Jesus statue (also being refurbished). All funds for this project will come from cemetery accounts.
