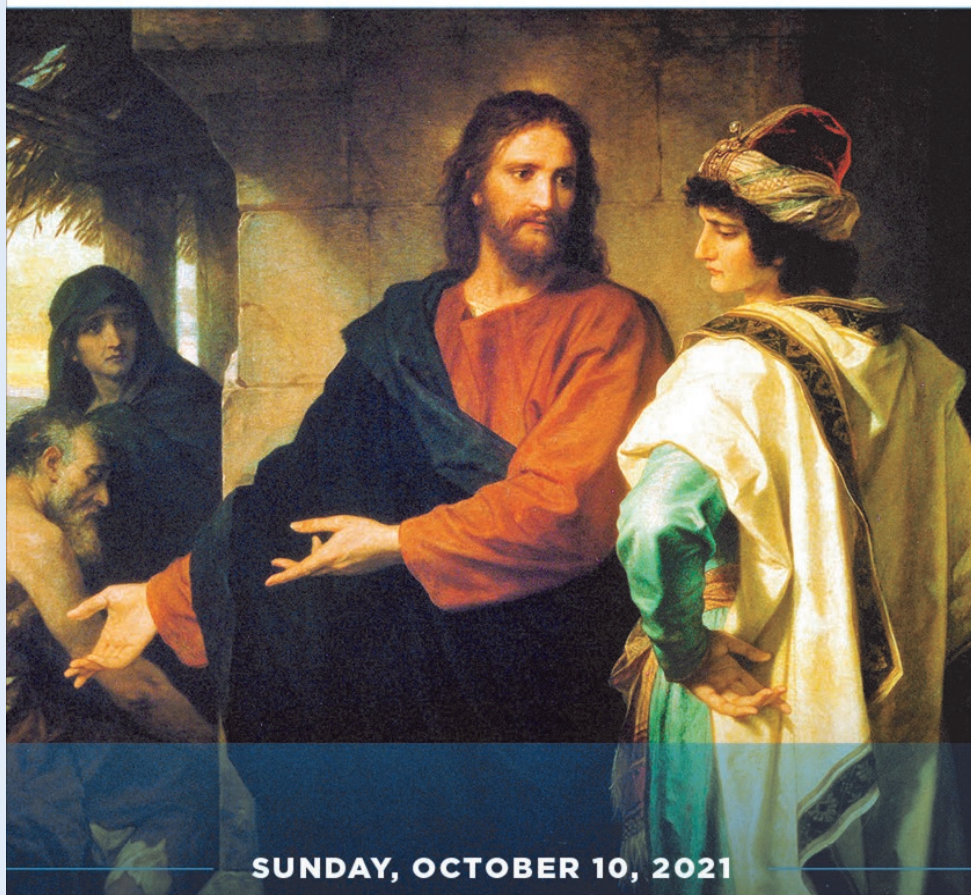

Dear parishioners and visitors,

As you have been reading in the bulletin, the annual celebration of the sacrament of the anointing of the sick will be given this week. This sacrament is one of two healing sacraments which the other is penance. Those who should receive this sacrament are listed in the announcement. It used to be that this sacrament was given when a Catholic was dying. That was why the sacrament was known as an extreme unction. Probably most Catholics never received this sacrament because they died before it could be given. Since the Second Vatican Council, the sacrament can be conferred more often especially to those who are aging. Care is to be given not to confer too often in a given year to the same person. Generally, one would receive it once a year.

This is the sacrament that I have seen miracles take place if I can be so bold. I have seen people healed physically and, more so, spiritually. If physical healing will not happen, then spiritually healing is most important. Sometimes it is not only important for the one being anointed for spiritual healing but family and friends as well. In that situation, it is important to pray for those receiving it as they surrender themselves to the will of God.

Spanish, Culture Club and French Club
This quarter Spanish class has been learning the
Glory Be in Spanish as well as saying the sign of
the cross in Spanish. Lower elementary students
have been learning the greetings, alphabet and
numbers 0-20. Upper elementary is learning more
vocabulary to talk about others and what is
around them as well as using 'the' with
nouns. They are also learning numbers but are
working on numbers 0-100. Middle School has
just completed Unit 1 vocabulary words and then
using them in sentences with 'is' and 'are' in
Spanish. They are reviewing 0-100 and learning
to write numbers in the thousands. All students
have learned about some of the Spanish saints
and have also learned the names of the Holy
Family, the Trinity and some of the angels in
Spanish. Culture club has met once so far. They
learned about the country of Panama and made
Mola cloths done by the Kuni people there. The
students tried Hojaldras which is flat fry bread with
butter, sugar and cinnamon. The French club has
met once also. They have just started to learn
some French greetings and the alphabet. They
tried croissants with Babybel cheese which is the
most popular cheese among French kids. It is
often an after school snack. We have many things
to do yet this year and all students are doing
exceptionally well!
